RATIONALE:

To address incorrect references and to clarify the penalty applicable when utilising more than the set amount of tyres.

ACTION:

Amend 2009 CAMS Online Manual of Motor Sport, Sporting Regulations, 2009 Australian Rally Championship Sporting Regulations as follows:

- “9.2 Any driver intending to test, within 90 days of an ARC event in an area which could reasonably be expected to fall under Article **9.1** ~~10.1~~ shall be required to contact the event organisers....”
- “9.3 The restrictions imposed by Article **9.1** ~~10.1~~ will also apply to drivers who have....”
- “9.5 Notwithstanding the provisions of Article **9.1** ~~10.1~~, event organisers may provide testing....”
- “19.8 (iii) The Driver & Co-Driver with the most stage wins over all of the stages of the event will be allocated one additional point in the same manner as in Article ~~20.2~~ **19.2.1**(ii).”

Amend 2009 CAMS Online Manual of Motor Sport, Sporting Regulations, 2009 Australian Rally Championship Technical Regulations, as follows:

- 4.1 “.....by series requirements (refer **Part 1**, Article **19.3** ~~20.3~~, ~~Part 1~~) and for Rally Tasmania (tarmac) all competitors are limited to a maximum of 10 tyres only.”
- “4.3 Additional tyres **over those specified in Article 4.1 or Part 1, Article 19.3** may be used but will result in a penalty of two minutes per tyre in excess of the maximum permitted. If a crew is directed by a scrutineer to replace a tyre for safety reasons, such replacement will also result in a penalty of two minutes per tyre if the maximum number of tyres is exceeded.”
- “5.10 Immediately upon completion of the event, cars will be held in parc fermé in accordance with Part 1, Article **16** ~~17~~ until such time as the period specified in Article 5.12 (iii) has expired.”
