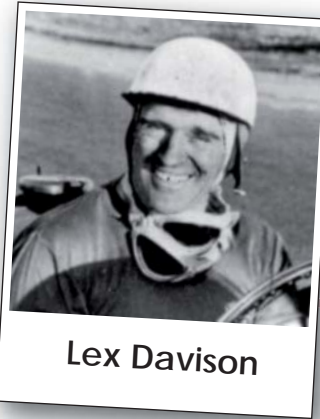

## Lex Davison

- Inaugural winner of the CAMS Gold Star in 1957 as champion Australian racing driver.
- Four-time winner of the Australian Grand Prix (1954, 1957, 1958, 1961).
- Three-time winner of the Australian Hill Climb Championship (1955, 1956, 1957).
- Drove the famous 'Bluebird' and provided support to Donald Campbell during the land speed record attempt in 1964 at Lake Eyre (SA).
- Took the first Holden overseas to compete in the 1953 Monte Carlo Rally.
- Competed at Le Mans in 1961 in an Aston Martin with Bib Stillwell.
- Sponsored the Joseph Lucas-Lex Davison Series at Calder Park with encouraged young drivers.
- President of the Light Car Club of Australia when it staged the Australian Grand Prix at Albert Park, Melbourne in 1956.

## The Foundation

The Australian Motor Sport Foundation Ltd (AMSF) was established in 2001 by the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), the governing body for motor sport in Australia. The aim of the AMSF is to help talented young Australian drivers reach the pinnacle of motor sport, in particular the FIA Formula One World Championship or the FIA World Rally Championship.

The following is a selection of drivers to have previously received assistance from the AMSF: Daniel Ricciardo, Will Power, Will Davison, Chris Atkinson and James Courtney. Both Power and Ricciardo are now performing at the top level in the international arena and Courtney and Davison are forging very successful careers at the pinnacle of Australian motor sport.

The Foundation also operates a national initiative called the CAMS Rising Star Program, to help develop young driving talent locally. Drivers who successfully graduate from this program often receive support from the Foundation to help continue their career internationally.

The goal of the Foundation is to be in a position to help our most talented young drivers reach their full potential (regardless of their own financial resources); however, to do this it will need significant financial support.



## What is a Bequest?

A bequest is a gift made in your Will. You can make bequests to individuals, associations or charities. A bequest to the AMSF is an investment in young Australian drivers of the future. A Will is a personal matter and ultimately your own decision. Naturally we will be very grateful if you include the AMSF in your Will, after you have provided for your loved ones.

## Types of Bequests

A bequest made to the AMSF may be:

- A specific bequest – the gift of a specific sum of money or nominated asset such as shares and other investments, life insurance, cars, memorabilia or other valuables;
- A bequest of your entire estate or a specified share or percentage of your entire estate (after all debts and expenses have been paid);
- A residual bequest – what remains of your estate after all debts and expenses have been paid and other gifts distributed or a specified share or percentage of your residual estate;
- After a life interest – when property such as a house, is left to a beneficiary to occupy or receive income during their lifetime (or another specified period) and then passes to AMSF.

If you wish to make a bequest to the AMSF we recommend that you discuss it with your solicitor.

## Lex Davison Society

The Bequest Initiative has led to the establishment of the Lex Davison Society to recognise and honour those who make bequests to the Foundation during their lifetime. The patrons of the Lex Davison Society are Diana and Tony Gaze.
